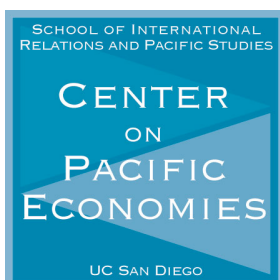

Dr. Kheang Un will discuss his recent paper entitled "The Politics of Natural Resource Use in Cambodia." Among other issues, it deals with the Cambodia People's Party (CPP) / Hun Sen domination of Cambodian politics through the deepening of neo-patrimonialism.

Dr. Un, a Khmer Rouge survivor, grew up and was educated in Cambodia before he left the country for higher education in the United States in 1992, when the country was reopened after decades of isolation from the international community. He earned a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science and Economics with distinction from the University of Hawai'i in 1996, a Master of Arts in Political Science and Southeast Asian Studies from Northern Illinois University in 1999 and a Doctorate Degree in Political Science and Southeast Asian Studies from Northern Illinois University in 2004. Dr. Kheang Un is currently a Visiting Fellow at the University of Louisville's Center for Asian Democracy and will be returning to Northern Illinois University in Fall 2009 as Assistant Director of the Center for Southeast Asian Studies and Assistant Professor of Political Science.
